



ALL ROLES




AGE DISTRIBUTION ACROSS SOLICITORS

AGE DISTRIBUTION ACROSS ALL OTHER STAFF













RELIGION OR BELIEF




SCHOOL TYPE

Question: School type from 11 to 16


SCHOOL TYPE DISTRIBUTION ACROSS ALL STAFF

Independent / fee-paying school




SCHOOL TYPE DISTRIBUTION ACROSS SOLICITORS




PARENTS ATTENDING UNIVERSITY

PARENTS ATTENDING UNIVERSITY DISTRIBUTION ACROSS ALL STAFF







WORK OF THE HIGHEST INCOME EARNER DISTRIBUTION ACROSS ALL STAFF




WORK OF THE HIGHEST INCOME EARNER DISTRIBUTION ACROSS SOLICITORS


